"At-School" Supplies

Quantity	Item	Use
1 (at least)	<i>Erasermate</i> Pens BLACK INK ONLY!	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Used for final copies Black ink is easier to erase and to read Label with student's name
Tons!	#2 Pencils or "Pop-a-Point" pencils	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Just about everything (<i>LAUSD supplies some pencils, but it's handy for students to have a ready supply.</i>)
good, thick pack	Quadrille graph paper	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Used for math... it helps students line up numbers and to complete calculations more efficiently. (<i>LAUSD supplies some quadrille paper, but we use a lot and it's also handy for students to have a ready supply.</i>)
1	Dictionary— paperback Try 99-cents Only Store	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Language Arts and any written work (<i>We have 10 dictionaries supplied by the school, but the word list is often too limited for our needs.</i>)

"At-Home" School Supplies

1 (at least)	<i>Erasermate</i> Pens BLACK INK ONLY!	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Used for final copies Black ink is easier to erase and to read
1	black, permanent ink pen (or razor-tip <i>Sharpie</i>)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Used for outlining in most art and acrostic assignments
Tons!	#2 Pencils or "Pop-a-Points"	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Points need to be sharp. Read below.
1	A good pencil sharpener	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sharp pencils are a must! Work produced with a dull point will not be accepted.
Assorted	Highlighter markers: light green, yellow, orange, pink, blue AND Colored Markers	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Used for acrostics homework for Star of the Week. This is a weekly assignment.
1 box	Crayons	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Used in a variety of assignments.
On-going	WIDE-RULED, LOOSE LEAF notebook paper with left and right margin lines . The paper MUST BE standard sized.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Please make sure that paper is loose-leaf. Do NOT purchase a spiral notebook for writing supplies. I will not accept tear-outs—even the cool, "clean-tear" type.
50+ sheets	Quadrille graph paper	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Used for math...it helps students line up numbers and complete calculations more efficiently.
	Good dictionary	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students are expected to carefully check spelling.

Here are Some "No-nos..."
