#3. *How does Anna's mother get the wool spun into yarn?*

- Anna and her mother called all the people that helped make Anna's coat, to celebrate Christmas.
- Anna and her mother invited the people who helped make her coat for Christmas and her mom makes Christmas cake.
- Anna and her mother celebrated Christmas by inviting everybody who helped make her coat and making a cake.
- Anna and her mother invited all the people that helped make Anna's coat for Christmas.

General Problems:

- Many students simply did not review all of their written answers to make sure that their writing was clear and was an example of their best grammar and spelling.
- Clearly describing the trading process. Using the word "trade" or "traded" would have helped.
- Not giving the full details. Anna's mother was a nice lady but her niceness wasn't enough to prompt the tradespeople into giving their services away for free.
- There were problems in dropping necessary verbs. Without these verbs, the sentence was confusing.
- There were problems with simple spelling and grammar: "stoped" and "women" instead of "woman."
